Advent Starts this Sunday, December 1st

The word advent comes from the Latin term adventus meaning "arrival" or "coming," particularly the coming of something having great importance. Advent season, then, is both a time of joy-filled, anticipatory celebration of the arrival of Jesus Christ and a preparatory period of repentance, meditation, and penance. The three main colors of the candles are purple, pink, and white. Purple symbolizes repentance and royalty. (In the Catholic church, purple is also the liturgical color at this time of year.) Pink represents joy and rejoicing. And white stands for purity and light. The first purple candle is called the Prophecy Candle or Candle of Hope.

Immaculate Conception Mass

Is on Monday December 9th. It will be at 5:30 p.m. at both OLL and St. Josaphat's. The Immaculate Conception is the belief that the Virgin Mary was free of original sin from the moment of her conception. This is a Holy Day of Obligation so Mass should be attended by all.
